Your ATOS Convention Planning Coordinator completed work with host chapters for ATOS annual conventions in Indianapolis (2014), and Philadelphia/Wilmington (2015). Discussions are proceeding for possible 2016 annual conventions in Western Reserve (Cleveland) area, and later conventions are under discussion in Tampa/Sarasota Florida and Salt Lake City.

Since 1986 (the past 28 years), ATOS has benefited from average annual income of \$13,658 in its share of convention profits. Cumulative income to ATOS from those 28 conventions has been **\$382,410**. The ATOS 40% share of profit from the Atlanta 2013 convention was \$14,151.65. This was above budget expectations. Paid attendance was approximately 438. All conventions were critically-acclaimed artistic successes.
